



## Christmas Tree Pin Cushion Sewing Pattern and Tutorial

*Pin cushion for a holiday mood on your sewing room or Christmas  
Ornaments for home décor, you choose!*



## LIST OF SUPPLIES

- » Fabric Scraps: 2 scraps with 14 cm x 12 cm / 5,5 inch x 4,2 inch each – *find the rectangle and the tree in the end of the tutorial*
- » Piece of ribbon with 8 cm / 3 inch;
- » Fiber filling;
- » Also needed the basic sewing supplies: scissor, pins, matching thread, iron;

### **Things to always have in mind:**

- Always remove pins when sewing to avoid hitting the pins with the needle while sewing;
- Don't forget to backstitch in the start and finish of all the seams you are going to make;
- Pattern included seam allowance of 0,6 cm / ¼ inch, use the seam allowance unless stated otherwise.
- *This pattern was designed in cm, all the measures in inch are calculated as the equivalent.*



## SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Iron your fabrics. Cut the fabric according to the pattern. Align all the materials to make sure you have everything you need.



2. Place the rectangles right side together and pin them on the top corners:



3. Draw the tree into the fabric. Don't forget to signal where the centre of the tree bottom stands, this is where you will pin the ribbon. Also signal the gap on the side.

4. Pin the ribbon on the tree bottom. The raw edges will be “outside” your drawing. Then pin the bottom corners of your rectangle!



*PS: If you wish to hang this Tree as an Ornament you can, on this step, also add a small ribbon right on top of the tree for hanging purposes!*

5. Sew all around, leaving the gap open!



6. Cut all around the tree, with an allowance of 0,3 cm /0,12 inch aprox. On the gap, leave it a bit bigger so the hand stitching of the gap gets easier. Then turn to the right side, using a sharp object to turn the corners (I am using my crochet needle):

7. Insert the fiber filling until you feel it's fluffy enough! You can pin the gap to hand stitch! Use invisible stitch.



8. Done!!
